How to Apply

Step 1 Apply Print an application from our web site or pick up an application in our office CESL room 101. Submit the application with the application fee.

Step 2 Register All students must apply, register, and pay tuition in full before taking the placement test. Students studying in Tucson at CESL must show proof of MMR immunization before taking the placement test.

Step 3 Placement Test The placement test is given the week **before** classes start. Check the webpage for specific dates.

Eligibility Students must be at least 18 years of age or a high school graduate, literate in their first language, and provide a local address.

B-2 and F-2 visa holders may attend no more than a total of 11.5 hours a week at CESL.

MMR Immunizations (MMR = measles, mumps and rubella) All students born since 1956 must provide proof of TWO measles vaccinations and ONE rubella vaccination. You must bring proof of these immunizations for class on the UA campus. If you do not have documentation, you may be immunized at the Pima County Health Clinics http://www.pimahealth.org/immunizations/adult_imm.html or the University of Arizona Health Center where the MMR is available.
